Mrs. Eleanor M. Steigenga, age 83, passed away after a long illness on January 26, 2004 in Muskegon. She was born on June 25, 1920 in E. Chicago, Indiana to Charles & Anna (Anderson) Oland, and had resided in the Muskegon area for most of her life. Mrs. Steigenga had worked at Hardy-Herpolsheimer's, Eastown Service for 28 years, as a secretary at Hope Reformed Church and Wolf Lake United Methodist Church, and most recently for the Red Cross. She was a member of Forest Park Covenant Church, after being confirmed and attending Samuel Lutheran Church for many years.
