Mr. Everett B. Sherwood, age 87, died Tuesday, March 9, 2004, in Grand Haven at the home of his daughter, Charlene. He was born December 5, 1916 in Grand Rapids to Clarence & Bessie (Hutchinson) Sherwood and had resided most of his life in the Muskegon area. Mr. Sherwood was a self-employed painter and decorator; and attended Calvary Church. On October 9, 1944 he married the former Virginia Lawton and she preceded him in death on March 26, 1996. Everett was a WW II veteran having served in the European Theater with the U.S. Army Air Force.
