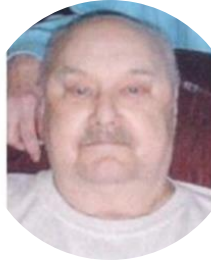

Mr. Thomas Crotty, Jr., age 79, passed away peacefully at his home surrounded by his loving family on Friday, May 9, 2008. He was born in Muskegon on February 12, 1929 to Thomas Glen and Dolores (McMahon) Crotty, Sr. and had been a life resident of the area. Mr. Crotty was a Veteran of the United States Army. He had been employed by Fisher Steel and Supply as a crane operator for many years before retiring in 1985. Mr. Crotty was a member of First Christian Reformed Church. 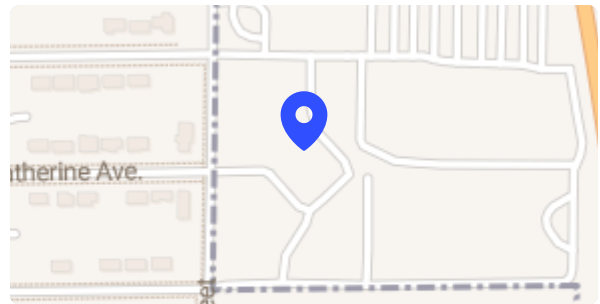

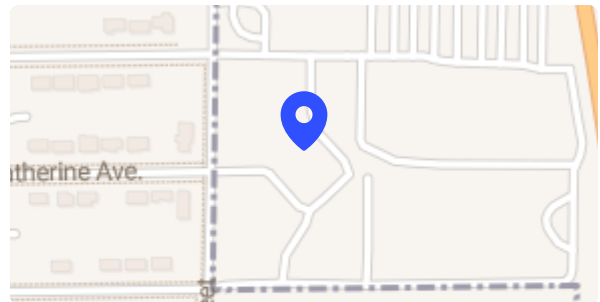
