Ronald E. Veihl, Sr., age 73, passed away on Friday, June 17, 2016. He was born on October 2, 1942 to Ernest and Betty (George) Veihl in Muskegon. Prior to his retirement in 2011, Ron had worked 48 years as a machinist at Teledyne Continental. Ron lived a full life and was truly a sports enthusiast. In 1960, playing at Muskegon Heights, he achieved All State awards in football. He then went on to play junior college in Sterling CO, and achieved All-American honors for both offense and defense. Ron ended his football career playing spring ball at Utah and moved back to Muskegon. Over the years, Ron enjoyed umpiring, refereeing and coaching many different sports. He played on the Teledyne fast-pitch team and won numerous city champ titles. When it comes to being a fan, Ron was one of the biggest University of Michigan fans you could find. He watched any sport associated with U of M. He and his wife, Barb of 34 years loved their log-cabin home, casino trips and watching the Tigers. Ron was a proud member of Local #113. 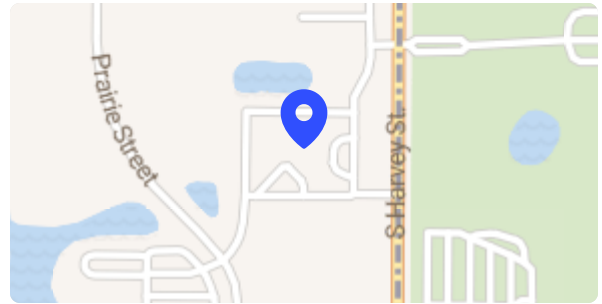

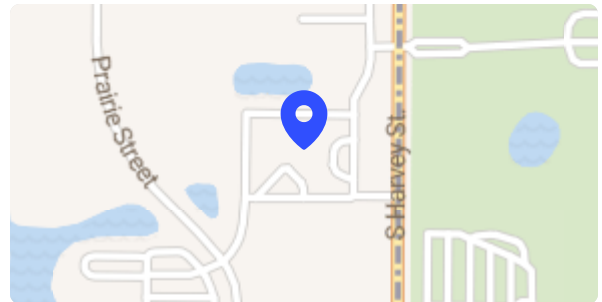

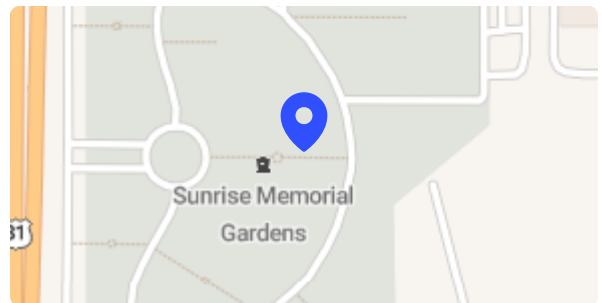
