. Mr. Stanley George Stephens, age 87, passed away at the Harbor Hospice Poppen Residence on March 26, 2012. He was born on February 8, 1925 to Stanley G. and Bessie (Coad) Stephens in Muskegon. Stan served his country in the U.S. Navy during WWII. He was a member of First Christian Reformed Church and the DAV Wood-Tazelaar Post #11. Stan was a letter carrier for the US Post Office until his retirement in 1983. On December 3, 1948 he married the former Ann Doornbos and she survives him along with his sons, Terrance and Edward Stephens, both of Muskegon and his daughters, Sandra (Larry) Fairbanks of Grand Haven and Yvonne "Vonnie" (Doug) Wilson of Muskegon; grandchildren, Melissa (George Hoodhood) Havey, Joel (Renee) Wiard, Kristina (Brian) Trasky and Stephanie (James) Burns; 5 great-granddaughters, Lexxis, Keyara, Sophia, Joeline and Anna Marie.
