Mr. Angus J. Blackmer Jr., age 87, passed away Friday afternoon, April 6, 2018, at his home. Angus was born November 12, 1930 to Angus and Stella (Piasecki) Blackmer in Muskegon. He served his country in the U.S. Army during the Korean War. On April 24, 1954, Jack married the former Marilyn F. Leonard, and she survives him. Jack had worked at Shaw Box Crane/Dresser/ Lift Tech for 43 years, retiring in 1996, where he had served as union president and a board member of the Shaw Box Crane Credit Union. He was a longtime member of St. Thomas The Apostle Catholic Church, and a member of the VFW Post #3195. Jack was also longtime cub scout master, an avid Lions fan, and enjoyed fishing and golfing. He also enjoyed dancing with Marilyn, and all the time spent with the grandchildren and great grandchildren. 




