Mr. George Brewster, age 91, passed away Saturday, December 1, 2012 at home. He was born February 7, 1921 in Woodville, MI to Charles and Myrtle (Waybill) Brewster. George was a 1938 graduate of Muskegon High School and served in the U.S. Navy during WWII. He was employed as a patternmaker and retired from Anderson Pattern in 1980. 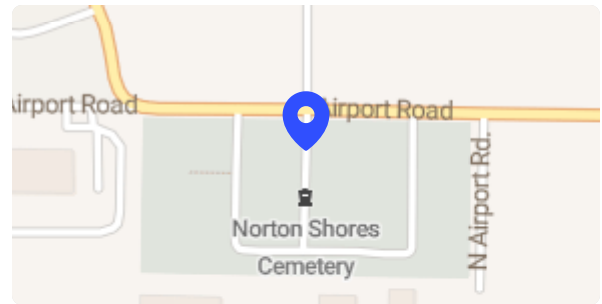
