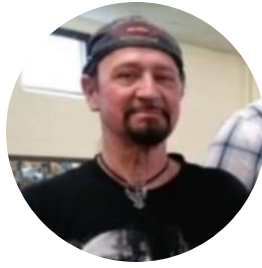

Joseph S. "Joe" Karchinski, age 73, passed away Tuesday, May 28, 2024 at Corewell Health – Butterworth Hospital. He was born January 14, 1951 in Muskegon to Clarence and Betty (Veihl) Karchinski and was a lifelong resident of the area. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War, although he never saw combat duty. On January 11, 1975, he married Margo Y. Becklin in Muskegon. Joe worked 26 years at Meijer and retired in 2009 from Johnson Controls. Joe was given the gift of life when he received a double lung transplant in 2013.
