Joseph "Joe" Lawrence Terry, passed away on June 15, 2024, in Muskegon, Michigan, at the age of 79. He was born on December 9, 1944, in San Francisco, California, to Sam and Helen Terry. Joe is survived by his wife, Sue Terry, his children, Joseph (Teri), Lori (Mark), and David (Nancy), five grandchildren, one great-grandchild named after him, and brothers, Ron and Dan Terry. He was preceded in death by his parents.
